The Claimant has filed a claim with the City of Fond du Lac regarding a fallen tree limb that fell on her vehicle on August 7, 2021. Claimant is alleging that the City is at fault. The City's Insurance Adjuster has investigated this matter and is recommending denial of claim because the City had no previous notice or prior knowledge that the limb was about to fall or was diseased or damaged.

Accordingly, the City Attorney's Office recommends that this claim be denied. As this matter may become litigation, it is not appropriate to discuss the merits of this claim in open session.

Municipal and Recreational Immunities

Or

The Claimants Didn't Do Anything Wrong Why Did Our Insurance Deny Their Claim?

A Brief Explanation of the Immunity Granted to Municipalities by the Wisconsin Legislature and Courts

- I. <u>Consider the Following Claims Submitted by Visitors, Residents or</u> Businesses:
- A. Sewer back up in main resulting in nine inches of sewage in a residence
 - B. Keel of a 24' sailboat ripped off at boat landing
 - C. Water utility valve fails, flooding a basement
 - D. Branch from tree falls during wind resulting in damage
 - E. Weeds obscure other vehicles and auto accident occurs
 - F. Elderly lady slips on icy sidewalk breaking hip
 - G. Baseball player breaks ankle stepping in an outfield hole

In each case, the claimant did not do anything wrong. However, after investigating each claim, a municipal insurance carrier recommended that the municipal council or board deny the claim because a Municipality faced with one of these situations **may** have immunity which will absolve it from responsibilities for damage.

Let's take a look at each example.

II. First - a few definitions:

A. Recreational Immunity

- 1. Municipalities have broad immunity for liability to a person engaged in a recreational activity on municipal property.
- 2. Wisconsin Statutes Section 895.52 provides that a Municipality or its officials or employees **do not** owe to any person who enters the Municipality's property to engage in a recreational activity 1) a duty to keep the property safe for recreational activities; 2) a duty to inspect the property; or 3) a duty to give warning of an unsafe condition, use or activity on the property.
- 3. However, a Municipality may face liability during recreational activities when (a) an accident occurs on Municipal property where the Municipality charges an admission fee; or (b) an accident is caused by a malicious act or by a malicious failure to warn against a known unsafe condition; or (c) an accident occurs during organized team sport activities sponsored by the Municipality.

B. Discretionary Immunity

- 1. A Municipality is granted immunity when its officials or employees exercise discretion in carrying out governmental activities or functions. In other words, a discretionary act is one that involves judgment when applying the facts. This type of immunity is also called Municipal Immunity.
- 2. Wisconsin Statutes Section 893.80(4) provides that no suit may be brought against a Municipality or its officials or employees for acts done in the exercise of legislative, quasi-legislative, judicial or quasi-judicial functions.

C. Ministerial Duty

- 1. <u>However, Municipalities may not be granted immunity for negligence or nonperformance of ministerial duties.</u>
- 2. A ministerial duty is imposed on a Municipality where the acts required of its officials or employees are absolute, certain and imperative, involving merely the performance of a specific task when the law imposes, prescribes and defines the time, mode and occasion for the task's performance with such certainty that nothing remains for judgment or discretion.

- 3. Such defined tasks can include policies adopted by a Municipality or otherwise imposed on Municipal employees that do not allow for discretion in carrying out the defined task. *Pries v. McMillon*, 2010 WI 63, 326 Wis.2d 37, 784 N.W.2d 648
- 4. Ministerial duties can also be imposed by laws, ordinances, statutes, or administrative codes. For example, a ministerial duty could arise when a Municipality was required by code to place a water main at a specific minimum depth. *DeFever v. City of Waukesha*, 2007 WI App 266, 306 Wis. 2d 766, 774, 743 N.W.2d 848.

III. Now – let's look at each claim:

A. Sewer back-up in main resulting in nine inches of sewage in a residence

- 1. Decisions regarding the adoption, design and implementation of a sewer system are discretionary or legislative acts subject to immunity under Wisconsin Statute Section 893.80(4). *MMSD v. City of Milwaukee*, 2005 WI 8, ¶ 60, 277 Wis. 2d 635, 691 N.W.2d 658.
- 2. However, where a homeowner's basement flooded with sewage in back-to-back months from the city sewer system, the court held that while the decision to install and provide a sewer system in a community is a discretionary decision, there may be no discretion as to maintaining the system so as not to cause injury to residents.

 Menick v. City of Menasha, 200 Wis. 2d 737, 547 N.W.2d 778 (Ct. App. 1996).
- 3. If the Municipality <u>does not</u> have notice about leaks or potential problems in the sewer system, it may be granted immunity from liability for injuries or damages. The key to the Municipality's defense would be to show regular and systematic procedures to inspect and clean the system. *See*, *e.g.*, *Freitag v. Montello*, 36 Wis. 2d 409, 153 N.W.2d 505 (1967); and *Sambs v. City of Brookfield*, 66 Wis. 2d 296, 224 N.W.2d 582 (1975).

B. Keel of a 24' sailboat ripped off at boat landing

1. Because Wisconsin recreational immunity encourages a Municipality to provide services and construct facilities for recreational use, the Municipality will generally be immune from liability for injuries or damages occurring on land or facilities meant for recreational use. *Crowbridge v. Village of Egg Harbor*, 179 Wis. 2d 565, 508 N.W.2d 15 (Ct. App. 1993).

- 2. Further, a Municipality can be granted immunity from liability for not only injuries or damage due to the facility itself, but for any injuries or damage sustained during a person's use of the facility. *Johnson v. City of Darlington*, 160 Wis. 2d 418, 466 N.W.2d 233 (Ct. App. 1991).
- 3. A Municipality can be granted immunity from damages to a sailboat if the sailboat's keel was damaged at the Municipality's boat landing, or if a sailboat was damaged in a storm because it was not allowed prompt access to dock due to the small size of a Municipality's marina.

C. Water Utility valve fails, flooding a basement

- 1. A Municipality is immune regarding decisions to adopt, design, and implement a public works (water) system because these activities involve governmental decisions and are thus discretionary. *MMSD v. City of Milwaukee*, 2005 WI 8, 277 Wis. 2d 635, 691 N.W. 2d 658.
- 2. In *DeFever v. City of Waukesha*, 306 Wis. 2d 766, 743 N.W.2d 848 (Ct. App. 2007), the court found that the Municipality was required to place the water main at a specified depth under law (thus constituting a ministerial duty) but there was no additional requirement regarding post-installation inspections or modifications.
- 3. If the Municipality not did know that conditions existed in the system and that such circumstances required a specific response, the Municipality may be granted immunity from liability for damages that occur.

D. Branch from tree falls during wind resulting in damage

- 1. A Municipality will not face liability unless there is a "known danger" that is compelling enough to warrant specific, non-discretionary action by a Municipality, thereby imposing a ministerial duty. *Lodl v. Progressive Northern Insurance* Co., 2002 WI 71, 253 Wis. 2d 323, 646 N.W.2d 314.
- 2. In *Domino v. Walworth County*, 118 Wis. 2d 488, 347 N.W.2d 917 (Ct. App. 1984), a motorcyclist was injured when her motorcycle struck a tree which had fallen across a road. The dispatcher was notified of the downed tree and assigned a squad to the scene. However, the dispatcher soon after reassigned the squad to another accident scene. Though her decision to divert the squad was discretionary, the dispatcher's conduct was not enough to qualify for discretionary immunity under 893.80(4) because her awareness of the downed tree resulted in a duty so clear and absolute that it falls within the concept of a ministerial duty.

3. Unless a Municipality had notice that there was a real danger that branches could damage property, a Municipality can be granted immunity from liability for damages to property resulting from fallen branches.

E. Weeds obscure other vehicle and auto accident occurs

- 1. A Municipality is not required to cut roadside vegetation and when it decides to do so anyway, it is immune from claims that result from obstructed vision. *Estate of Wagoner v. City of Milwaukee*, 2001 WI App 292, 249 Wis. 2d 306, 638 N.W.2d 382, rev. denied.
- 2. So long as there is no known danger or specific duty on the Municipality to cut the weeds or grass, the Municipality can be granted immunity from liability for injuries resulting from its decision to cut.
- 3. A specific duty existed, however, in *Physicians Plus Ins. Corp. v. Midwest Mut. Ins. Co.*, 2002 WI App 80, 254 Wis. 2d 77, 646 N.W.2d 777, where a man was injured when his motorcycle was struck by a vehicle driven through an intersection by a woman who claimed the stop sign was obstructed from her view by branches of a tree. Because the Municipality placed the stop sign at the intersection, it has responsibility to maintain the sign's visibility for motorists.

F. Elderly lady slips on icy sidewalk breaking hip

- 1. Under Wisconsin Statutes Section 893.83(1), municipalities have immunity for injuries due to the natural accumulation of ice or snow present less than three weeks. *Wagner v. WMMIC*, 230 Wis.2d 633, 601 N.W.2d 856 (App.1999) rev. denied.
- 2. Such immunity extends from streets and sidewalks (*Wagner*) to municipal parking lots. *Ellerman v. Manitowoc*, 2003 WI App 216, 267 Wis.2d 480, 671 N.W.2d 366
- 3. Even if a Municipality is not granted immunity from all potential liability for injuries from a person falling on a sidewalk, the person still has to show in court that the Municipality was negligent in its duty to maintain the sidewalk and that the person's injuries were due to the Municipality's negligence.

G. Baseball player breaks ankle stepping in an outfield hole

1. A Municipality has been granted immunity if an injury occurs during a recreational activity that is related to the use, condition or maintenance of the Municipality's property and if the Municipality did not sponsor such activity.

- 2. Recreational immunity applied in *Kautz v. Ozaukee County Agricultural Society*, 2004 WI App 203, 276 Wis. 2d 833, 688 N.W.2d 771, where a young girl was infected with E. coli from animal waste on playground equipment during a county fair.
- 3. If a baseball or softball player sprains an ankle running through the outfield of a municipal field, the Municipality may be granted immunity.

IV. Why is a Municipality granted immunity

- 1. Immunity is granted because the Municipality is performing services or providing facilities for the benefit of the public. Without immunity for discretionary conduct or recreational activity, local government would be significantly burdened with the time and costs of litigation and judgments that may follow.
- 2. Subjecting Municipal employees and officials to liability for injuries or damages stemming from the performance of their jobs may discourage individuals from serving the public. Where Municipalities and their employees and officials are granted immunity, local governments are able to better function in providing essential services and facilities to the public.
- 3. Even when there is no immunity, a claimant still must prove that the acts of a Municipality's officials or employees were negligent and caused the claimant's damages. In many claims where there have been injuries or damages there is no proven casual connection to the municipality.

On August 19, 2021, Assistant Chief Klein and Division Chief of Fire Prevention Garth Schumacher met with the applicants, Pedro and Natasha Silva to discuss thier application for a Class B combination license for Casa del Tequila located at 525 N Peters Ave.

The applicants are in the process of purchasing the restaurant operations from the current owner. The applicants advised that this will be a turn-key sale and that they plan on some minor cosmetic changes to the interior of the business, such as adding additional booths. They will also be licensing the outdoor patio area which will allow for outside customer dining and beverage service. Mr. Silva has almost 17-years in the restaurant business and was previously the chef at Casa del Tequila and Ms. Silva has over 5-years in the restaurant business.

The planned hours of operation for the business are Monday thru Thursday 11am to 9pm, Friday and Saturday from 11am to 11pm and Sunday 8am to 8pm.

Assistant Chief Klein discussed with the applicants the City's expectations of being a license holder and the importance of being a "good neighbor."

Background checks conducted on the applicants, both in-house and NCIC/CIB, indicate no criminal history that would preclude them from obtaining the requested license. The Police Department has no objections to the approval of the proposed license request.

On August 25, 2021, Assistant Chief Klein spoke with the applicant, Jeff Korneli, regarding his request for a Class B combination license for the Spectrum Roller Rink located at 605 Fond du Lac Ave.

The applicants have purchased the Spectrum Roller Rink and plan to continue operations at this location. Mr. Korneli indicated that they are adding a new bar to the interior of the building and have installed a new skate floor and will be adding a new kid's game area at the back of the building. Mr. Korneli indicated that they will also be adding an outside patio/lounge area outside the front entrance of the building.

Mr. Korneli indicated that the facility will be used for Weddings, Reunions, Birthday Parties, Roller Skating and kids gaming area. He anticipates being open for special events and with eventual regular hours for skate Thursday thru Sunday with a 10pm closing time.

Mr. Korneli owns and operates a number of licensed establishments within the City and has done so for a number of years with no concerns noted by law enforcement. He will serve as the licensed agent for this location. Assistant Chief Klein discussed with the applicants' the City's expectations of being a license holder.



Re: Ordinance 3736 – Amending Chapter 65, Finance and Taxation, Related to Federal

Procurement Policy

The Federal Government established uniform guidance to provide recipients of federal funds with streamlined administrative requirements, cost principles, and audit requirements for federal awards. The requirements are published in Title 2 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Part 200.

To obtain and keep federal funding, an entity (City of Fond du Lac) must comply with the established Procurement Standards within 2 CFR Part 200. In general, if there is a conflict between Federal standards and an entity's own statutes, ordinances, rules and regulations, entities are required to comply with whichever requirement is more stringent.

The proposed language to be inserted into the Municipal Code of the City of Fond du Lac through Section 1 of Ordinance 3736 states that the City will adhere to all applicable Procurement Standards within 2 CFR Part 200.

When the Municipal Code was last re-codified, there was an inaccuracy included. The inaccuracy currently states that all procurements greater than \$25,000 require a sealed bid process, when historically the threshold requiring sealed bids was \$50,000, except for public construction projects.

The State of Wisconsin Statute 62.15 (1) establishes the following regarding public construction:

"All public construction, the estimated cost of which exceeds \$25,000, shall be let by contract to the lowest responsible bidder; all other public construction shall be let as the council may direct."

What constitutes "public construction" under the bid law?

"Activities concerned with the erection of buildings and bridges, the construction of streets and highways, and other similar public improvements which require the combining of materials, supplies and labor. Mere maintenance and other public works which do not involve the actual combining of materials and labor with a definable end result would unlikely constitute public construction." Natkins, Smith, & Van Swearingen, Public Construction in Wisconsin, p. 50 (1985).

Sections 2 and 3 of Ordinance 3736 correct the inaccuracy by establishing 2 thresholds:

- \$25,000 for public construction projects, in compliance with the State Statues
- \$50,000 for all non-public construction projects, per local precedence

The updates to the Municipal Code in Ordinance 3736 ensure that the City, and any sub-recipients, will adhere to the requirements established by the Federal Government that allow agencies to obtain and keep federal funding, and correct the inaccuracy from the re-codification regarding sealed bid thresholds.

Staff recommends approval of the Ordinance.

ORDINANCE NO. 3736

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 65, FINANCE AND TAXATION, RELATED TO FEDERAL PROCUREMENT POLICY

The City Council of the City of Fond du Lac hereby do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That Chapter 65, Finance and Taxation, Section 65-7, Purchasing., is hereby created to read as follows:

Add Thereto:

- D.1. Federal Uniform Grant Guidance. For any and all procurements that apply Federal funding, City, and subrecipients, if any, will follow all applicable Procurement Standards as found in 2 CFR 200. In general, if there is a conflict, City, or subrecipient(s), will be required to comply with whichever requirement is more stringent, including the City's own statutes, ordinances, rules, and regulations; which may be more stringent than the Federal standards.
- **Section 2**. That Chapter 65, Finance and Taxation, Section 65-7.I., Purchasing., is hereby amended as follows:
- I. Formal contract procedure. All equipment, supplies and contractual services, except as otherwise provided herein or by statute, when the estimated cost shall exceed \$50,000 (\$25,000 for public construction), shall be purchased by formal, written bids and subsequent written contract from the lowest responsible bidder after notice inviting bids.
- **Section 3**. That Chapter 65, Finance and Taxation, Section 65-7.J., Purchasing., the first paragraph is hereby amended as follows:
- J. Quotation procedure. All purchases of equipment, supplies, and contractual services, when the estimated cost is between \$10,000 and \$50,000 (\$10,000 and \$25,000 for public construction), shall be made in accordance with the following procedure, except the procedure may be waived if the Agent determines it to be impossible or impractical:

Section 4. Any person violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall be subject to the penalty provided in Section 1-4 of the Code.

<u>Section 5</u>. The appropriate City officials are hereby authorized and directed to take such action as is necessary to effectuate the terms of this Ordinance.

Section 6. All other ordinances and resolutions inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

<u>Section 7</u>. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force upon its passage and publication as provided by law.

Chapter 65. Finance and Taxation

§ 65-7. Purchasing.

[Amended 6-27-1995 by Ord. No. 2793; 1-26-2000 by Ord. No. 2989; 7-13-2011 by Ord. No. 3462] A.

Purpose. The purpose of this section is to secure for the taxpayers the advantages and economies which will result from centralized control over the expenditures of funds for supplies, materials, equipment and contractual services; from the application of modern, businesslike methods to such expenditures; and from better utilization of the articles procured at public expense.

<u>B.</u>

Definitions. For the purpose of this section the following terms, phrases, words and their derivations shall have the meaning given below. When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future, words in the plural number include the singular number, and words in the singular number include the plural number. The word "shall" is mandatory and not merely directory. **CITY**

The City of Fond du Lac, Wisconsin.

CITY PURCHASING AGENT or AGENT

The Purchasing Agent of the City of Fond du Lac.

CONTRACTUAL SERVICES

Services that involve public construction or improvements rendered to the City by others under expressed or implied agreement, but shall not include professional and other contractual services which are in their nature unique and not subject to competition.

COUNCIL

The City Council of the City of Fond du Lac.

SUPPLIES

Includes all supplies, materials and equipment furnished to the City.

USING AGENCY

Any department, agency, commission, bureau or other unit in the City government using supplies or procuring contractual services as provided for in this section. The term is intended to apply to those agencies which are under the administrative jurisdiction of the City Manager.

C.

City Purchasing Agent. The Director of Administration shall serve as City Purchasing Agent and shall have general supervision of City purchasing. The Agent shall appoint a purchasing coordinator within the Comptroller's division who shall perform the duties prescribed by this section and all other duties assigned by the Agent.

D.

Scope of purchasing authority. The Agent shall purchase or contract for all equipment, supplies and contractual services needed and requisitioned by any using agency in the City except as otherwise provided in this section, in accordance with such rules and regulations as the City Manager may prescribe from time to time for the management and operation of the Division of Purchasing, in keeping with the spirit of this section.

(1)

Unauthorized purchases. Except as herein provided, no City officer or employee shall order the purchase of any equipment or supplies or make any contract within the purview of this section other

than through the Purchasing Agent, and any purchase ordered or contracts made contrary to the provisions hereof shall not be binding on the City and shall make the purchaser personally liable.

(2)

Disqualification of bidders. The Agent shall have the authority to declare vendors who default on their bids or quotations irresponsible bidders and to disqualify them from receiving any business from the City for a stated period of time.

(3)

Committee on Standards and Specifications. The Agent shall prepare and secure with the cooperation of the City departments standard and written specifications for supplies used by the various branches of the City government. To assist the Agent in this work the City Manager may establish a Committee on Standards and Specifications to be composed of the City Purchasing Agent as Chairperson and such other officials as the City Manager may designate.

(4)

Exemptions from centralized purchasing. The Purchasing Agent may, and where legally required to do so shall, authorize in writing any agency to purchase or contract for certain specified classes of supplies, materials, equipment or contractual services independently of the Agent's office, but such purchases or contracts shall be made in conformity with the applicable provisions of this section. The Agent may also rescind such authorization to purchase independently by written notice to the agency concerned, unless otherwise prohibited by law.

(5)

Purchasing cards. Purchases of equipment, supplies and contractual services may be made through properly established purchasing cards or other similar means where permitted and authorized by the Agent. The City Manager shall promulgate rules and regulations governing the proper and authorized use of purchasing cards. The City Comptroller shall review monthly statements showing the actual expenditures for each using agency made through the use of purchasing cards. Improper or unauthorized use of purchasing cards may be cause for termination of employment or other disciplinary action.

<u>(6)</u>

Assistance. The Purchasing Agent shall have the power and authority to call upon any officer, board, department or commission to furnish information or otherwise assist in the purchasing function if within the scope of such officer, board, department or commission.

D.1. Federal Uniform Grant Guidance. For any and all procurements that apply Federal funding, City, and subrecipients, if any, will follow all applicable Procurement Standards as found in 2 CFR 200. In general, if there is a conflict, City, or subrecipient(s), will be required to comply with whichever requirement is more stringent, including the City's own statutes, ordinances, rules, and regulations; which may be more stringent than the Federal standards.

<u>E.</u>

Requisitions and estimates. All using agencies shall file with the Agent detailed requisitions or estimates of their requirements in supplies and contractual services in such manner, at such time and for such future period as the Agent shall prescribe.

Encumbrance of funds. Except in cases of emergency, the Agent shall not issue any order for delivery on a contract or purchase until the Comptroller shall have certified that there is to the credit of the

accounts of using agencies concerned a sufficient available unencumbered appropriation balance, in excess of all unpaid obligations, to pay the amount of such order.

G.

Gratuities. The acceptance of any gratuity in the form of cash, merchandise or any other thing of value by an official or employee of the City from any vendor or contractor or prospective vendor or contractor, except where given for the use and benefit of the City, shall be deemed to be a violation of this section and may be cause for termination of employment or other disciplinary action. The offer of any such gratuity to any official or employee of the City by any vendor or contractor, or prospective vendor or contractor, may be cause for declaring such individual or firm to be an irresponsible vendor and for barring him or it from bidding as provided by this section.

<u>H.</u>

Competitive bidding required. All purchases of and contracts for equipment, supplies and contractual services shall, except as specifically provided herein, be based wherever practicable on competitive bids. No splitting of orders as an evasion of the procedure described herein shall be permitted.

I.—
Formal contract procedure. All equipment, supplies or public construction, except as otherwise provided herein or by statute, when the estimated cost shall exceed \$25,000, shall be purchased by formal, written bids and subsequent written contract from the lowest responsible bidder after notice inviting bids.⁴¹

I. Formal contract procedure. All equipment, supplies and contractual services, except as otherwise provided herein or by statute, when the estimated cost shall exceed \$50,000 (\$25,000 for public construction), shall be purchased by formal, written bids and subsequent written contract from the lowest responsible bidder after notice inviting bids.

(1)

Notice inviting bids. Notice inviting bids shall be published one or more times in the official newspaper of the City and/or in an appropriate trades journal at least five days preceding the last day set for the receipt of proposals. The newspaper notice required herein shall include a general description of the articles to be purchased and shall state where bid blanks and specifications may be secured and the time and place for opening bids.

(2)

Bidders' list for public construction contracts. The Agent shall also solicit sealed bids from all responsible prospective suppliers who have requested their names be added to a bidders' list which the Agent shall maintain by sending them a copy of such newspaper notice or such other notice as will acquaint them with the proposed purchase or sale. In any case, invitations sent to the vendors on the bidders' list shall be limited to commodities that are similar in character and ordinarily handled by the trade group to which invitations are sent.

(3)

Bid deposits. When deemed necessary by the Agent and/or when required by state law, bid deposits shall be required in an amount within the discretion of the Agent to assure that the successful bidder will execute a contract. Unsuccessful bidders shall be entitled to return of the bid deposit where the Agent has required the same. A successful bidder shall forfeit any bid deposit required by the Agent upon failure on his part to enter a contract within 10 days after the award, unless such time is extended by the City.

Bid opening procedure. Bids shall be submitted to the Agent. They shall be identified as bids on the envelope and opened in public at the time and place stated in the public notices. A tabulation of all the bids received shall be recorded and open to public inspection.

(5)

Rejection of bids.

(a)

The Agent shall have the authority to reject all bids or parts of all bids for any equipment, supplies or contractual services included in the proposed contract when the public interest shall be served thereby.

(b)

No bid shall be awarded to a contractor who is in default on the payment of taxes, licenses or other moneys due the City or who has defaulted on a previous contract with the City.

(6)

Award of contract.

<u>(a)</u>

Committee on Awards. Contracts within the purview of this section shall be awarded by a Committee on Awards composed of the City Manager, who shall serve as Chairperson, the Director of Public Works and the Purchasing Agent.

(b)

Lowest responsible bidder. Contracts shall be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder. In determining "lowest responsible bidder," in addition to price, the Committee on Awards shall consider the ability, capacity and skill of the bidder to perform the contract or provide the service required; whether the bidder can perform the contract or provide the service promptly or within the time specified without delay or interference; the character, integrity, reputation, judgment, experience and efficiency of the bidder; the quality of performance of previous contracts or services; the previous and existing compliance by the bidder with laws and ordinances relating to the contract or service; the sufficiency of the financial resources and ability of the bidder to perform the contract or provide the service; the quality, availability and adaptability of the equipment, supplies or contractual services to the particular use required; the ability of the bidder to provide future maintenance and service and the potential cost of such maintenance and service for the use of the subject of the contract; and the number and scope of conditions attached to the bid.

(c)

Tie bids. If two or more low bids are received for the same contract total amount, unit price, quality and service being equal, the contract shall be awarded to a resident bidder. If there is no resident bidder, the contract shall be awarded to one of the tie bidders by drawing lots.

(d)

Award to other than lowest bidder. When the award is not given to the lowest bidder, a full and complete statement of the reasons for doing so shall be prepared by the Agent and filed with other papers relating to the transaction.

(7)

Performance bonds. The Agent shall have the authority to specify the requirements of a performance bond before requesting bids and entering a contract, in such amount as he shall find reasonably necessary to protect the best interests of the City.

(8)

Prohibition against subdivision. No contract or purchase shall be subdivided to avoid or circumvent the requirements of this section.

Quotation procedure. All purchases of equipment, supplies and contractual services, when the estimated cost is between \$10,000 and \$25,000, shall be made in accordance with the following procedure, except the procedure may be waived if the Agent determines it to be impossible or impractical:

Quotation procedure. All purchases of equipment, supplies, and contractual services, when the estimated cost is between \$10,000 and \$50,000 (\$10,000 and \$25,000 for public construction), shall be made in accordance with the following procedure, except the procedure may be waived if the Agent determines it to be impossible or impractical:

(1)

Minimum number of quotations. Quotation purchases, wherever practicable, shall be based on at least three competitive quotations and shall be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder in accordance with the standards set forth in Subsection **I(6)** above.

(2)

Notice inviting quotations. The Agent may solicit quotations by direct request in person, by mail, telephone, or through internet websites without advertisement.

(3)

Recording. The Agent shall keep a record of all orders and the quotations obtained and such records shall be open to public inspection.

K. Exceptions.

(1)

Exceptions to bidding or quotation procedures. Purchases of equipment, supplies and contractual services when the estimated cost is less than \$10,000 may be made without the benefit of formal bids or quotations. Solicitation of quotations for purchases of less than \$10,000 is encouraged but not required.

(2)

State contract or cooperative purchasing. Purchases of equipment, supplies or services through State of Wisconsin or other governmental cooperative purchasing plans is encouraged. Purchases made through such cooperative plans may be made without the requirement to solicit formal bids or quotations since such purchases are already based on competitive pricing.

(3)

Petty expenditures. Purchases of supplies or services in amounts less than \$500 may be made from properly established petty cash accounts by the heads of using agencies for incidentals and shall be reviewed by the Comptroller's Division and approved for reimbursement. The City Manager shall promulgate rules and regulations for the use of petty cash accounts.

(4)

Professional services. Contracts for professional services may be entered into by the City Manager or the Director of Administration without the requirement for competitive bidding since professional services are by their nature unique.

<u>(5)</u>

Real estate transactions. All real estate transactions shall be made subject to the approval of the City Council, provided that the City Manager or other City officials may perform all delegable functions in connection therewith as the City Council may direct.

(6)

Emergency purchases. An emergency shall be deemed to exist when a breakdown in machinery or in an essential service occurs or when unforeseen circumstances arise, including delays by contractors, delays in transportation and unanticipated volume of work. If an emergency occurs during regular business hours, the head or other employee of the using agency shall immediately notify the Agent who shall either purchase the required commodity or service or authorize the using agency to do so. If the Agent is unavailable, the head of the using agency shall notify the City Manager before making the purchase. If an emergency occurs at times other than regular business hours, the using agency may purchase directly the commodity or commodities required. If the estimated cost of the emergency purchase exceeds \$10,000, the head of the agency shall, wherever possible, secure competitive quotations and order delivery to be made by the lowest responsible bidder. On every emergency purchase made the agency head shall not later than one week thereafter submit to the Agent a requisition, a tabulation of quotations received, if any, a delivery receipt and a written explanation of the circumstances of the emergency. The records of such emergency transaction shall be open to public inspection during regular business hours.

(7)

Proprietary purchases. Proprietary, patented equipment, supplies or services available from only one source shall be exempt from the requirement for competitive bidding or quotations.

(8)

Purchases of used equipment. Purchases of used equipment, materials or supplies may be authorized by the Agent without the use of the formal bid or quotation procedure outlined in this section.

(9)

Donations. Purchases of equipment, materials, supplies, and services made in conjunction with projects for which any materials have been donated or any labor for the project has been provided by volunteers shall be exempt from this section.

L.

Inspection and testing. The using agency shall inspect all deliveries of equipment, supplies or contracted services made to such using agencies to determine their compliance with the quantities and specifications set forth in the order or contract.

Μ.

Surplus equipment, materials or supplies. The Agent shall have the authority to sell surplus equipment, materials or supplies or to exchange the same for or trade on new purchases, or to authorize the disposal of such items.

<u>(1)</u>

Using agencies. Using agencies shall notify the Agent of any surplus equipment, materials or supplies which may have become obsolete, unsuitable or no longer needed prior to the disposal of such items.

(2)

Permission of the Agent. Other City employees shall not be permitted to sell, remove or dispose of surplus items without the permission of the Agent. Improper, unauthorized removal or disposal or unauthorized personal use of City property, including surplus property, may be cause for termination of employment or other disciplinary action.


