





They have agreed in concept to the light pole location and to grant the City an easement for our poles and conduit.



#### COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AMENDMENT


#### Existing Land Use Designation: General Commercial & Transportation

#### **Analysis**

The Comprehensive Plan identifies where growth should occur and makes recommendations of future development. Reflective of the dynamics of development and growth, the Comprehensive Plan carries an expectation that amendments would be needed to address changing conditions of land use and development.

The two parcels identified above are located directly northwest of the round-about at W Pioneer Road and S Hickory Street. The Comprehensive Plan identifies one parcel for future general commercial use (FDL-15-17-21-14-751-01). The other parcel is an abandoned railway line and the Comprehensive Plan identifies it for future transportation use (FDL-15-17-21-14-753-00). Mercury Marine is located northwest, nearby both parcels. Mercury Marine is planning on acquiring these vacant parcels for future industrial development.

To facilitate future industrial development of both parcels, a change of zoning from commercial to industrial is proposed. In considering appropriate zoning for a property continuity between zoning and land use is required. In other words, the *zoning* of a property must reflect the *use* of the property. The proposed industrial zoning of the subject properties conflicts with the existing land use designations for both commercial and transportation uses; therefore, a change to the Comprehensive Plan is necessary in order for the zoning to change.

The suggested industrial land use designation expands an existing area of the same land use category. The proposed land use designation reflects the industrial development anticipated for the subject properties.

The Comprehensive Plan Amendment and rezoning proposal will be considered as separate items on the September 13<sup>th</sup> Plan Commission agenda.

#### Recommendation

The process for amending the Comprehensive Plan is the same used for adoption of the Plan. Community Development staff advises the Plan Commission recommend to the City Council a change of land use designation for the parcel identified as FDL-15-17-21-14-751-01, from General Commercial to Industrial; and for the parcel identified as FDL-15-17-21-14-753-00, from Transportation to Industrial.







### Analysis

The subject properties are located directly northwest of the round-about at S Hickory St and W Pioneer Road. The three properties are zoned C-2 (General Business); a change of zoning to M-1 (Industrial) is proposed. The site in total, is approximately 11.88 acres of undeveloped land owned by two separate entities. Mercury Marine is in the process of acquiring all three parcels.

Neighboring properties adjacent to the subject properties are zoned M-1 in all directions. Further development of the subject properties for commercial uses is not anticipated and/or likely given the land is currently undeveloped and in a predominantly industrial area.

The proposed rezoning would extend an area of existing industrial zoning of adjacent properties to the subject properties. The proposed rezoning also reflects the intended industrial use of the properties after acquisition by Mercury Marine. Approval of the

proposed rezoning would not create a negative effect or harm to any adjacent or nearby property.

The Comprehensive Plan identifies where growth should occur and makes recommendations of future development. Wisconsin's comprehensive planning legislation requires that an action for rezoning be consistent with the Comprehensive Plan. In other words, the *zoning* of a property must reflect the *use* of the property. The proposed zoning (industrial) for two parcels conflicts with the current Comprehensive Plan land use designations. Parcel FDL-15-17-21-14-751-01 is designated for general commercial uses; parcel FDL-15-17-21-14-753-00 is designated for transportation uses); therefore, a change to the Comprehensive Plan is necessary in order for the zoning to change.

The Comprehensive Plan Amendment and rezoning proposal will be considered as separate items on the September 13<sup>th</sup> Plan Commission meeting agenda.

#### Recommendation

Community Development staff advises the Plan Commission recommend to the City Council rezoning of parcels FDL-15-17-21-14-751-01, FDL-15-17-21-14-752-01, and FDL-15-17-21-14-753-00 from C-2 (General Business) to M-1 (Industrial).

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 3738**

### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 65, FINANCE AND TAXATION, RELATED TO FEDERAL PROCUREMENT POLICY

The City Council of the City of Fond du Lac hereby do ordain as follows:

**Section 1**. That Chapter 65, Finance and Taxation, Section 65-7, Purchasing., is hereby created to read as follows:

### **Add Thereto**:

- D.1. Federal Uniform Grant Guidance. For any and all procurements that apply Federal funding, City, and subrecipients, if any, will follow all applicable Procurement Standards as found in 2 CFR 200. In general, if there is a conflict, City, or subrecipient(s), will be required to comply with whichever requirement is more stringent, including the City's own statutes, ordinances, rules, and regulations; which may be more stringent than the Federal standards.
- **Section 2**. That Chapter 65, Finance and Taxation, Section 65-7.I., Purchasing., is hereby amended as follows:
- I. Formal contract procedure. All equipment, supplies and contractual services, except as otherwise provided herein or by statute, when the estimated cost shall exceed \$50,000 (\$25,000 for public construction), shall be purchased by formal, written bids and subsequent written contract from the lowest responsible bidder after notice inviting bids.
- <u>Section 3</u>. That Chapter 65, Finance and Taxation, Section 65-7.J., Purchasing., the first paragraph is hereby amended as follows:
- J. Quotation procedure. All purchases of equipment, supplies, and contractual services, when the estimated cost is between \$10,000 and \$50,000 (\$10,000 and \$25,000 for public construction), shall be made in accordance with the following procedure, except the procedure may be waived if the Agent determines it to be impossible or impractical:

# Chapter 65. Finance and Taxation

# § 65-7. Purchasing.

[Amended 6-27-1995 by Ord. No. 2793; 1-26-2000 by Ord. No. 2989; 7-13-2011 by Ord. No. 3462] A.

Purpose. The purpose of this section is to secure for the taxpayers the advantages and economies which will result from centralized control over the expenditures of funds for supplies, materials, equipment and contractual services; from the application of modern, businesslike methods to such expenditures; and from better utilization of the articles procured at public expense.

<u>B.</u>

Definitions. For the purpose of this section the following terms, phrases, words and their derivations shall have the meaning given below. When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future, words in the plural number include the singular number, and words in the singular number include the plural number. The word "shall" is mandatory and not merely directory. **CITY** 

The City of Fond du Lac, Wisconsin.

#### **CITY PURCHASING AGENT or AGENT**

The Purchasing Agent of the City of Fond du Lac.

#### **CONTRACTUAL SERVICES**

Services that involve public construction or improvements rendered to the City by others under expressed or implied agreement, but shall not include professional and other contractual services which are in their nature unique and not subject to competition.

### **COUNCIL**

The City Council of the City of Fond du Lac.

#### **SUPPLIES**

Includes all supplies, materials and equipment furnished to the City.

#### **USING AGENCY**

Any department, agency, commission, bureau or other unit in the City government using supplies or procuring contractual services as provided for in this section. The term is intended to apply to those agencies which are under the administrative jurisdiction of the City Manager.

C.

City Purchasing Agent. The Director of Administration shall serve as City Purchasing Agent and shall have general supervision of City purchasing. The Agent shall appoint a purchasing coordinator within the Comptroller's division who shall perform the duties prescribed by this section and all other duties assigned by the Agent.

#### D.

Scope of purchasing authority. The Agent shall purchase or contract for all equipment, supplies and contractual services needed and requisitioned by any using agency in the City except as otherwise provided in this section, in accordance with such rules and regulations as the City Manager may prescribe from time to time for the management and operation of the Division of Purchasing, in keeping with the spirit of this section.

(1)

Unauthorized purchases. Except as herein provided, no City officer or employee shall order the purchase of any equipment or supplies or make any contract within the purview of this section other

than through the Purchasing Agent, and any purchase ordered or contracts made contrary to the provisions hereof shall not be binding on the City and shall make the purchaser personally liable.

(2)

Disqualification of bidders. The Agent shall have the authority to declare vendors who default on their bids or quotations irresponsible bidders and to disqualify them from receiving any business from the City for a stated period of time.

(3)

Committee on Standards and Specifications. The Agent shall prepare and secure with the cooperation of the City departments standard and written specifications for supplies used by the various branches of the City government. To assist the Agent in this work the City Manager may establish a Committee on Standards and Specifications to be composed of the City Purchasing Agent as Chairperson and such other officials as the City Manager may designate.

(4)

Exemptions from centralized purchasing. The Purchasing Agent may, and where legally required to do so shall, authorize in writing any agency to purchase or contract for certain specified classes of supplies, materials, equipment or contractual services independently of the Agent's office, but such purchases or contracts shall be made in conformity with the applicable provisions of this section. The Agent may also rescind such authorization to purchase independently by written notice to the agency concerned, unless otherwise prohibited by law.

(5)

Purchasing cards. Purchases of equipment, supplies and contractual services may be made through properly established purchasing cards or other similar means where permitted and authorized by the Agent. The City Manager shall promulgate rules and regulations governing the proper and authorized use of purchasing cards. The City Comptroller shall review monthly statements showing the actual expenditures for each using agency made through the use of purchasing cards. Improper or unauthorized use of purchasing cards may be cause for termination of employment or other disciplinary action.

<u>(6)</u>

Assistance. The Purchasing Agent shall have the power and authority to call upon any officer, board, department or commission to furnish information or otherwise assist in the purchasing function if within the scope of such officer, board, department or commission.

D.1. Federal Uniform Grant Guidance. For any and all procurements that apply Federal funding, City, and subrecipients, if any, will follow all applicable Procurement Standards as found in 2 CFR 200. In general, if there is a conflict, City, or subrecipient(s), will be required to comply with whichever requirement is more stringent, including the City's own statutes, ordinances, rules, and regulations; which may be more stringent than the Federal standards.

<u>E.</u>

Requisitions and estimates. All using agencies shall file with the Agent detailed requisitions or estimates of their requirements in supplies and contractual services in such manner, at such time and for such future period as the Agent shall prescribe.

Encumbrance of funds. Except in cases of emergency, the Agent shall not issue any order for delivery on a contract or purchase until the Comptroller shall have certified that there is to the credit of the

accounts of using agencies concerned a sufficient available unencumbered appropriation balance, in excess of all unpaid obligations, to pay the amount of such order.

G.

Gratuities. The acceptance of any gratuity in the form of cash, merchandise or any other thing of value by an official or employee of the City from any vendor or contractor or prospective vendor or contractor, except where given for the use and benefit of the City, shall be deemed to be a violation of this section and may be cause for termination of employment or other disciplinary action. The offer of any such gratuity to any official or employee of the City by any vendor or contractor, or prospective vendor or contractor, may be cause for declaring such individual or firm to be an irresponsible vendor and for barring him or it from bidding as provided by this section.

<u>H.</u>

Competitive bidding required. All purchases of and contracts for equipment, supplies and contractual services shall, except as specifically provided herein, be based wherever practicable on competitive bids. No splitting of orders as an evasion of the procedure described herein shall be permitted.

I.—
Formal contract procedure. All equipment, supplies or public construction, except as otherwise provided herein or by statute, when the estimated cost shall exceed \$25,000, shall be purchased by formal, written bids and subsequent written contract from the lowest responsible bidder after notice inviting bids.<sup>41</sup>

I. Formal contract procedure. All equipment, supplies and contractual services, except as otherwise provided herein or by statute, when the estimated cost shall exceed \$50,000 (\$25,000 for public construction), shall be purchased by formal, written bids and subsequent written contract from the lowest responsible bidder after notice inviting bids.

#### (1)

Notice inviting bids. Notice inviting bids shall be published one or more times in the official newspaper of the City and/or in an appropriate trades journal at least five days preceding the last day set for the receipt of proposals. The newspaper notice required herein shall include a general description of the articles to be purchased and shall state where bid blanks and specifications may be secured and the time and place for opening bids.

(2)

Bidders' list for public construction contracts. The Agent shall also solicit sealed bids from all responsible prospective suppliers who have requested their names be added to a bidders' list which the Agent shall maintain by sending them a copy of such newspaper notice or such other notice as will acquaint them with the proposed purchase or sale. In any case, invitations sent to the vendors on the bidders' list shall be limited to commodities that are similar in character and ordinarily handled by the trade group to which invitations are sent.

(3)

Bid deposits. When deemed necessary by the Agent and/or when required by state law, bid deposits shall be required in an amount within the discretion of the Agent to assure that the successful bidder will execute a contract. Unsuccessful bidders shall be entitled to return of the bid deposit where the Agent has required the same. A successful bidder shall forfeit any bid deposit required by the Agent upon failure on his part to enter a contract within 10 days after the award, unless such time is extended by the City.

Bid opening procedure. Bids shall be submitted to the Agent. They shall be identified as bids on the envelope and opened in public at the time and place stated in the public notices. A tabulation of all the bids received shall be recorded and open to public inspection.

#### (5)

Rejection of bids.

(a)

The Agent shall have the authority to reject all bids or parts of all bids for any equipment, supplies or contractual services included in the proposed contract when the public interest shall be served thereby.

(b)

No bid shall be awarded to a contractor who is in default on the payment of taxes, licenses or other moneys due the City or who has defaulted on a previous contract with the City.

(6)

Award of contract.

<u>(a)</u>

Committee on Awards. Contracts within the purview of this section shall be awarded by a Committee on Awards composed of the City Manager, who shall serve as Chairperson, the Director of Public Works and the Purchasing Agent.

(b)

Lowest responsible bidder. Contracts shall be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder. In determining "lowest responsible bidder," in addition to price, the Committee on Awards shall consider the ability, capacity and skill of the bidder to perform the contract or provide the service required; whether the bidder can perform the contract or provide the service promptly or within the time specified without delay or interference; the character, integrity, reputation, judgment, experience and efficiency of the bidder; the quality of performance of previous contracts or services; the previous and existing compliance by the bidder with laws and ordinances relating to the contract or service; the sufficiency of the financial resources and ability of the bidder to perform the contract or provide the service; the quality, availability and adaptability of the equipment, supplies or contractual services to the particular use required; the ability of the bidder to provide future maintenance and service and the potential cost of such maintenance and service for the use of the subject of the contract; and the number and scope of conditions attached to the bid.

(c)

Tie bids. If two or more low bids are received for the same contract total amount, unit price, quality and service being equal, the contract shall be awarded to a resident bidder. If there is no resident bidder, the contract shall be awarded to one of the tie bidders by drawing lots.

(d)

Award to other than lowest bidder. When the award is not given to the lowest bidder, a full and complete statement of the reasons for doing so shall be prepared by the Agent and filed with other papers relating to the transaction.

(7)

Performance bonds. The Agent shall have the authority to specify the requirements of a performance bond before requesting bids and entering a contract, in such amount as he shall find reasonably necessary to protect the best interests of the City.

(8)

Prohibition against subdivision. No contract or purchase shall be subdivided to avoid or circumvent the requirements of this section.

Quotation procedure. All purchases of equipment, supplies and contractual services, when the estimated cost is between \$10,000 and \$25,000, shall be made in accordance with the following procedure, except the procedure may be waived if the Agent determines it to be impossible or impractical:

Quotation procedure. All purchases of equipment, supplies, and contractual services, when the estimated cost is between \$10,000 and \$50,000 (\$10,000 and \$25,000 for public construction), shall be made in accordance with the following procedure, except the procedure may be waived if the Agent determines it to be impossible or impractical:

#### (1)

Minimum number of quotations. Quotation purchases, wherever practicable, shall be based on at least three competitive quotations and shall be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder in accordance with the standards set forth in Subsection **I(6)** above.

#### (2)

Notice inviting quotations. The Agent may solicit quotations by direct request in person, by mail, telephone, or through internet websites without advertisement.

(3)

Recording. The Agent shall keep a record of all orders and the quotations obtained and such records shall be open to public inspection.

#### K. Exceptions.

#### (1)

Exceptions to bidding or quotation procedures. Purchases of equipment, supplies and contractual services when the estimated cost is less than \$10,000 may be made without the benefit of formal bids or quotations. Solicitation of quotations for purchases of less than \$10,000 is encouraged but not required.

#### (2)

State contract or cooperative purchasing. Purchases of equipment, supplies or services through State of Wisconsin or other governmental cooperative purchasing plans is encouraged. Purchases made through such cooperative plans may be made without the requirement to solicit formal bids or quotations since such purchases are already based on competitive pricing.

#### (3)

Petty expenditures. Purchases of supplies or services in amounts less than \$500 may be made from properly established petty cash accounts by the heads of using agencies for incidentals and shall be reviewed by the Comptroller's Division and approved for reimbursement. The City Manager shall promulgate rules and regulations for the use of petty cash accounts.

#### (4)

Professional services. Contracts for professional services may be entered into by the City Manager or the Director of Administration without the requirement for competitive bidding since professional services are by their nature unique.

#### <u>(5)</u>

Real estate transactions. All real estate transactions shall be made subject to the approval of the City Council, provided that the City Manager or other City officials may perform all delegable functions in connection therewith as the City Council may direct.

(6)

Emergency purchases. An emergency shall be deemed to exist when a breakdown in machinery or in an essential service occurs or when unforeseen circumstances arise, including delays by contractors, delays in transportation and unanticipated volume of work. If an emergency occurs during regular business hours, the head or other employee of the using agency shall immediately notify the Agent who shall either purchase the required commodity or service or authorize the using agency to do so. If the Agent is unavailable, the head of the using agency shall notify the City Manager before making the purchase. If an emergency occurs at times other than regular business hours, the using agency may purchase directly the commodity or commodities required. If the estimated cost of the emergency purchase exceeds \$10,000, the head of the agency shall, wherever possible, secure competitive quotations and order delivery to be made by the lowest responsible bidder. On every emergency purchase made the agency head shall not later than one week thereafter submit to the Agent a requisition, a tabulation of quotations received, if any, a delivery receipt and a written explanation of the circumstances of the emergency. The records of such emergency transaction shall be open to public inspection during regular business hours.

#### (7)

Proprietary purchases. Proprietary, patented equipment, supplies or services available from only one source shall be exempt from the requirement for competitive bidding or quotations.

#### (8)

Purchases of used equipment. Purchases of used equipment, materials or supplies may be authorized by the Agent without the use of the formal bid or quotation procedure outlined in this section.

#### (9)

Donations. Purchases of equipment, materials, supplies, and services made in conjunction with projects for which any materials have been donated or any labor for the project has been provided by volunteers shall be exempt from this section.

#### L.

Inspection and testing. The using agency shall inspect all deliveries of equipment, supplies or contracted services made to such using agencies to determine their compliance with the quantities and specifications set forth in the order or contract.

#### Μ.

Surplus equipment, materials or supplies. The Agent shall have the authority to sell surplus equipment, materials or supplies or to exchange the same for or trade on new purchases, or to authorize the disposal of such items.

#### <u>(1)</u>

Using agencies. Using agencies shall notify the Agent of any surplus equipment, materials or supplies which may have become obsolete, unsuitable or no longer needed prior to the disposal of such items.

#### (2)

Permission of the Agent. Other City employees shall not be permitted to sell, remove or dispose of surplus items without the permission of the Agent. Improper, unauthorized removal or disposal or unauthorized personal use of City property, including surplus property, may be cause for termination of employment or other disciplinary action.

That way, the City Code stays current with the State Code and we do not have to make multiple updates to our City Code if the State Code is amended. The intent of our ordinance was follow the exception allowed under state law.
