Friends of Taylor Park and Pool

Our Story

The story begins with a group of friends who grew up in the neighborhood surrounding Taylor Park and Pool and who spent much of their youth hanging out at the park and swimming in the pool. They called themselves Taylor Park University. When the City of Fond du Lac contemplated closing the pool in 2011, this group sprang into action, changed their name to Friends of Taylor Park and Pool, incorporated as a non-profit entity, and began raising funds to support the operation of the pool. They ultimately raised \$20,000. The pool remained open and the organization now continues to help with improvements to the park and pool.

What have we done for the park?

- 1. Purchase five replacement trees each year
- 2. Purchased a gazebo for the park
- 3. Began the "Blue Squirrel" adventure
- 4. Purchased the signs for the "History Walk"
- 5. Contracted for landscaping around the entrance sign
- 6. Paid for half of the repair and repainting of the pavilion
- 7. Sponsored Christmas caroling last December

What have we done for the pool?

- 1. Had Mindy Leitner paint an incredible mural on the pool wall
- 2. Purchased an umbrella for the poolside seating area
- 3. Purchased lawn chairs for the pool area
- 4. Paid for half of the floor resurfacing in the lobby area
- 5. Paid for 59% of the recent floor resurfacing in the pool building
- 6. Sponsored swimming passes for many community groups
- 7. Sponsored family nights at the pool

What do we hope to do the the future

- 1. Continue to support pool maintenance and improvements
- 2. Advocate for security cameras
- 3. Reduce the administrative burden in sponsoring events
- 4. Sponsor musical events in the park
- 5. Sponsor art events in the park
- 6. Encourage other types of activities in the park
- 7. Continue to sponsor community groups for swimming
- 8. Continue to buy trees for the park

Taylor Park and its pool are community treasures located on the west side of Fond du Lac. We want to help preserve the park and the pool so that future generations will have the same opportunity to enjoy them as we have. I would like to share with you some photos of our accomplishments.

Re: Park History Plan

Through our park review process, the idea was suggested to have information available on the history of all our parks. City staff has some information but it is not complete so further research is needed. Not having the expertise in this area, City staff recommend hiring/engaging a local expert or firm to gather the historical information.

At this meeting, we are asking the APB for suggestions on what local expert or firm could perform this work; how should the information be provided to the public (City website, on-site plaques, digitally with a QR code, etc.); and what is the desired timeline to complete the project.
